

Planning: Why It Matters



10,000 Americans turn 65 everyday



By 2060, nearly 1 in 4 Americans is projected to be an older adult



Seniors volunteer, vote, and donate to charity at higher rates than any other generation



1 in 3 seniors is economically insecure, with higher rates among women and people of color



Nearly 95% of seniors have at least 1 chronic health condition



2.5 million grandparents report taking care of grandchildren's needs

CASOA Findings



It is estimated that older Virginians contribute \$38.5 billion annually to their community through employment, volunteerism and caregiving.



Compared to national benchmarks, Virginia's results are **typical** for Community Livability measures and Older Adult Challenges measures



More CASOA Findings

79% Older residents rated their overall quality of life as excellent or good

45% Older residents reported housing needs

24% Older adults reported mobility needs

30% Older adults reported financial challenges



Selected Outcomes

Short-Term

- More older Virginians who are eligible will receive SNAP benefits and participate in the Senior Farmers Market Program
- Virginians will have increased awareness of and be more easily connected to services across the continuum

Intermediate-Term

- AAA services reach more Virginians who have the greatest economic and social needs
- Virginians will receive coordinated home and community-based services that reduce unnecessary emergency department visits and hospitalizations
- Caregivers who use the Lifespan Respite Voucher Program will report reduced caregiver burden and high satisfaction with the Program

Long-Term

- Older adults experience decreased food insecurity/malnutrition and improved nutritional health
- Virginians will remain in their homes and communities longer, thus generating systemic cost avoidance for more expensive institutional services

Intrastate Funding Formula (IFF)

Purpose

- Distribute OAA funds to the 25 AAAs across Virginia based on population factors & weights
- Intended to target funding to older
 Virginians with the greatest economic
 & social needs

Why Change?

- Federal concerns
 - Last updated 10+ years ago
 - Outdated figures
 - Reexamine base funding
- Need for technical changes to conform to new federal IFF guidance


New IFF

- 40% Rolling Base
- Factors & Weights:

Weight	Factor
50%	60+ in Poverty
20%	60+
10%	60+ in Rural Areas
10%	60+ Minority in Poverty
10%	Share of Population (Density)
