
DATA FROM THE 2019 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Virginia, more than 1 in 4 unpaid caregivers are providing care to a loved one with Alzheimer's or another dementia.

<u>Nearly two-thirds</u> of dementia caregivers have been providing care for at least two years. <u>More than 1 in 3</u> dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.


More than 1 in 4 dementia caregivers are in the "sandwich generation" — caring for both someone with dementia and a child or grandchild.


Percent of dementia caregivers providing care for at least 2 years


Impact of Alzheimer's and dementia caregiving
